This application applies to all exchange programs taking place outside of Europe. Please observe the exact application requirements for the university to which you are applying.

With these documents you are applying first for participation in an exchange program of the University of Stuttgart. Upon being accepted to the exchange program, you are required to compile the application documents required by your host university. For this step, you will usually need to submit additional documents, as well as partly update the documents already submitted, and create English / Spanish / Portuguese translations.

## **Application Procedure:**

The selection of applicants is carried out by the Senate Committee for Foreign Studies and Support of the University of Stuttgart in conjunction with the International Office. In some cases, **Selection Interviews** are held to gain a personal impression of the candidates as "ambassadors" of the University of Stuttgart abroad. In general, the following selection criteria are used:

- academic qualifications
- explanation of the study project
- interests and activities outside of academic studies (e.g. participation in the *Buddy* Program for international students, student council, sport clubs, etc.)
- knowledge of Germany and the host country

After the **selection** you will be notified about your nomination and about which documents you must submit for the application to your host university. Since the number of placements at each partner university is limited and each university has certain requirements in terms of grades, study subjects, etc. it may not always be possible to honor your preferences.

In the case of **state-to-state programs**, the acceptance relates firstly to participation in this program. In your application you list three universities within this program as placement preferences. The coordinating university will pass on all applications from Baden-Württemberg with a proposal for the placement to the foreign coordinating university.

The **partner universities** generally leave the selection process to the University of Stuttgart and usually accept the nominations of the Senate Committee for Foreign Studies and Support. However, you **can be rejected** from these nominations if the admission requirements of the partner universities or a department are not met or a department has a Numerus Clausus. We always try to clarify these critical cases in advance, so that rejection is rare in practice.

Please visit a Group- and Individual Advising Session before applying to an exchange program!

## Please note the following:

During the course of the application procedure, you may receive a request from the International Office or from abroad to submit further documents. Therefore, check your e-mail and mail regularly so that the application procedure is not interrupted.

Exchange programs in USA, Canada: The TOEFL iBT examination must have already been taken at the time of the application deadline. The test results may be submitted later, but confirmation of completion of the examination must be uploaded to the application portal by the deadline. If the results may already be viewed electronically, please upload a screenshot of them to the portal. Please send at least one TOEFL-Report to the University of Stuttgart, International Office, Institution Code 0460 and Department code "99 – For any other department not listed." Exchange programs in Latin America: Proof of language skills in the language of instruction at the host university: at least B1-Level; if language of instruction is English, additionally proof of A1-Level Spanish required Exchange programs in Asia, Australia and South Africa: Information on the proof of English proficiency can be found on the homepage of the International Office.

	8	Certificate of Enrollment (German): With indication of Degree sought and semester number.			
	9	Absolute and relative classification of the final grade in the degree program ("Ranking")  The document must be from the current semester and can be requested from the examination office (Prüfungsamt).  Students who have not yet received any grades at the University of Stuttgart can request this document from their previous university. If this is not possible, you can alternatively submit a letter of recommendation from a lecturer at your previous university. It is advisable to have the letter of recommendation issued in English, in case it is also needed at a later date for the application at the host university. If applying to multiple exchange programs, please advise the professor/lecturer not to mention a specific university or program.  A template for the letter of recommendation can be found on the homepage of the International Office.  Request the recommendation as early as possible to ensure a timely submission
