	<input type="checkbox"/>	220 volt (travel) adapter for all electrical appliances	typical plugs and pluck socket in Germany: Type F
	<input type="checkbox"/>	Ethernet cable (LAN)	not all dormitories have Wi-Fi
	<input type="checkbox"/>	router	only if you want to install your own Wi-Fi network
	<input type="checkbox"/>	sheet, pillow, pillow case, blanket	depending on where you stay, check with your housing provider or your room mates
	<input type="checkbox"/>	second pair of glasses/ contact lenses	if needed
